
I enjoy being part of the sailing community, including as a volunteer in the recent Wooden Boat Festival. I look forward to contributing to the Classic Yacht Association.



A MEMBER'S STORY

Paul Krans sent an attention-getting apology for non-attendance at the AGM.

"I would attend, but I will be at work.... in Laos, where they still build classic wooden boats from a single teak log..."

Our sharp-eyed Administrator, Jane High, asked for more. Thanks Paul, for this fascinating insight into wooden boat construction of a very different sort. :-)





There was once an untouched jungle valley in central northern Laos where native flora could flourish and inaccessible teak trees could grow unthreatened by the global demand for teak lumber... until a hydro-electric dam was built about 2010. There is now a hydro lake in that oncehidden valley, so while the harvest and export of teak is now controlled globally, the local Hmong can harvest some of

these now-accessible majestic native trees for domestic use.

I regularly cross the dam on a NZ-built aluminium jet boat, far from "Classic boat" material. At one end of the trip and over the span of a few days, I was able to follow the construction of a traditional canoe constructed from one of these harvested teak trees. You can guess the size and age of the tree from the images. There were some cavities and splits and checks in the wood, but not a single knot in the entire length.

The log was floated to the construction site, rolled out of the water, milled with a portable chainsaw mill, dressed by hand with an electric hand planner running off a small "Iron Buffalo" diesel generator, all operating out of the small floating workshop in the backdrop... note the piles of shavings!





Construction was all steel nails and wooden pegs. The finish was a couple of coats of blue paint. Unfortunately, I did not get to see the finished boat in the water.

I expect it will be pushed along with the ubiquitous longtail setup so common in the region, although looking at all the thwarts it may also be paddle power which is now uncommon unless for

competition. Most of the new longtails we see on the dam are thin steel construction, so this craft is a little out of the norm and may have been built for more ceremonial purposes.

Smaller longtails are common on the dam, used by fishermen and families commuting between floating villages and the couple of road ends. These craft are easily swamped

and I have never noticed any buoyancy, so they will sink down fast. Other larger and faster boat operators need to be wary of the wash they generate.
