Years ago, on PRIZE, we used to organise something we called the "Boy's Own" weekend in early May, all based around the full moon in order that we be able to sail as far as possible over a long weekend. It was always subject to fair weather, a full moon, and never having to bring the mainsheet hard aboard.



Now, as the membership of the Classic Yacht Association matures, and the longing for the Hauraki Gulf is heightened, it was felt that getting out there in the good company of likeminded sailors was not a bad idea. This Autumn Rally is the third the Association has organised and it was certainly the most successful with three yachts, STARLIGHT, PRIZE, and for the first time the beautiful Couta

boat, ROSETTE, and the launch KOUMI, sailing to Te Kouma on Friday. Then 8 classics: PRIZE, STARLIGHT, LIMERICK, three other Towsons, and for one of her first outings after a major refit, FINN, and the recently purchased, beautiful Jim Young designed launch, NGARUNUI, turned up in Islington Bay.

(NOTE: Participation for the entlre event isn't essential. Join the fleet when and if it fits with your other commitments.)

The weather gods were certainly on our side. Friday had us enjoying a beautiful broad reach which turned into a beam reach to Te Kouma in a 10-15 knot south-westerly. This enabled us to sail down the northern side of Waiheke. On Saturday another beautiful wind, but this time a northerly, for the beam reach back to Islington Bay. The forecast for Sunday was threatening stronger northerlies



and rain, none of which eventuated, leaving us to have a beautiful sail home. Champagne sailing!

For the writer the two outstanding vessels of the weekend would have to be ROSETTE, the 30' gaff rigged Couta Boat, and NGARUNUI, the 48' Jim Young designed launch. ROSETTE is the only Couta boat in New Zealand. She is a very impressive, oversized mullet boat, very capable of making a serious open water passage at a very respectable speed. Dave Paynter, the owner, is going to enjoy many miles of extensive cruising on the NE coast of the North Island. NGARUNUI is a beautiful 48 footer and very capable of extended cruising the NE coast as well. Both vessels are very easy on the eye.

Rallying has got to be an alternative way of enjoying our fine vessels. Relaxed sailing, with nothing having to happen too quickly, slow starts to the day over a

hearty breakfast washed down with a good coffee, and all in the very good company of likeminded sailors. Not to forget the hospitality and good company of fellow Corinthians in the evenings.

The spring and autumn rallies will now be a fixture in the CYANZ events calendar. Do join us.
