BMW Auckland Regatta – 18, 19 and 20 March

All classic yacht skippers are earnestly urged to support this event

Now in the fourth year, the BMW Auckland Regatta in 2011 promises to provide some great sailing.

With racing every day starting, and finishing in the NLA (Northern Leading Light Area) the BMW Auckland Regatta will give meaning to Auckland being the City of Sails.

The sailing programme this year provides for specific Harbour Courses for those interested in "Cruising and or Passage" racing and Auckland's strong Classic fleet. These two divisions will not have any windward leeward races and will see their races starting between NLA and North Head. They will have their own dedicated committee boat (the classic "Lady Margaret") for the BMW Auckland Regatta.

All other division will be split between two other race course areas. All races each day will start in the NLA area between NLA and Browns Island with a short Harbour Course. This will see the fleet being divided into two courses, one in the Eastern Beach area for the larger boats, and the second will race in the NLA. Both of these courses will provide a series of windward leeward races on Friday 18th and Saturday 19th.

Sunday 20th March is a Long Harbour/Passage race for "all divisions starting and finishing in the NLA".

And remember, the "The Steinlager Beach Party on Saturday 19th". This the opportunity for all to share stories of the daily success, and perhaps, "what might have been", if you had not tack over so early. The last race on Saturday 19th March finishes at Motuihe where a live band will be playing to welcome all ashore with refreshments and fun. Motuihe will be "central party" on the 19th for the BMW Auckland Regatta

Entries for the BMW Auckland Regatta can be made on the website – www.bmwaucklandregatta.co.nz – or at the Royal New Zealand Yacht Squadron and Bucklands Beach Yacht Club.

All entries from all yacht clubs are welcome.
