

CYA PERPETUAL GUARDIAN REGATTA

The Perpetual Guardian regatta 21-23rd Feb was well represented this year with 20 yachts entering the five races over three days.

Thursday night 20th Feb the committee and host skippers held a welcome dinner at the RNZYS for 14 Australian visitors from Melbourne and Sydney. (A contingent of our Australian friends come every year to join our festivities, and we enjoy their return hospitality in Melbourne each November.)

The Thursday evening at the squadron also included a Life Membership award to Bruce Tantrum for his huge contribution to yachting over many years. Just a few of Bruce's contributions include many years of education of young sailors, his involvement in helping get Waitangi back to New Zealand, and the close relationship we now have with our Australian CYAA friends. David Glen, a long-time friend of Bruce's and owner of the famous yacht RAINBOW, gave an excellent recap of Bruce's many endeavours.

The three days of racing took place in very brisk sailing conditions. The competition was fierce, with close sailing, some of it too close!

The prizegiving on the Sunday night was very well attended by over 150 sailors and supporters, there to mix and mingle with friends and to applaud well-fought placings.

The Classic Yacht Assn of Australia (CYAA) President, Craig Brown, took the Trans-Tasman Trophy for the most placings sailed on any yacht during the regatta.

'We'll be back. It was an awesome regatta,' was the universal comment from the Australian contingent. A significant aspect of being a visitor is the chance to sail on a wide selection of yachts, thanks to the generosity of the skippers.


